Not very much ILS traffic this month, in fact all I have had passed to me are Dominie X5736 on 16/11 and Aztec 'RXF on 9/12.

Not quite in the ILS class was Cessna F172 WGE which did a

visual circuit and overshoot on 28/11.

Reported overflying the area On 24/11 was Shackleton 'MPCRS' inbound to Topcliffe, anyone who knows the serial should contact the editor.

With Yorkshire Light Aircraft the Cessna F172 'VAS did a ... C of A air test on 24/11 after its rebuild, it is believed to have bean delivered to its new owner at Newcastle on 10/12. Another departure from YLA is reported to be Cessna F150 TKE to Skegness. Cessna F172 * TIM which arrived for repair last month is known to be owned by YLA and was damaged when it overturned in the over-run area of the runway at Leicester East after an aborted take off on 1/8. Cessna F150 'TMK is now back in one piece and should be back in service soon.

Comanche 'RFH arrived on 24/11 and was still with Northair on 11/12, also with Northair is Aero Commander 500A 'SIO which is in for new radio equipment and ADF, this arrived on 10/12.

New to the Northern Air Taxi fleet is Beagle 206 'TYW which was finally delivered on 29/11 after many rumours of an earlire arrival. Other rumours suggest that Northean Air Taxis are to aquire a ten Leat specimen of the Beagle 200. The only one completed was 'WIN-we shall see, in 'Flight International' Northair are offering for sale a Beagle 206-1, two Cessna 337 s.one Gessna 210 and one Cessna F172, These are presumably 'TYC, 'TSM, 'XWN, 'XVE and 'WGX.

Notable visitors among the months movements are the following; The Mystere 20 VR-BDK which made its first visit on 5/12 and finally departed on 9/12. Although registered in Bermuda it is owned by Greek shipping million aire Stavros Niarchos who was visiting the

Jetstar N3E of Cameron Iron Works is still operating in Europe and has visited several times.

The new Aer Turas Argosy EI-AVJ visited on 22/11 and 23/11. it is c/n 6801 and was delivered to Dublin on 3/11 as CF-TAG being dry leased from Transair-Midwest of Winnipeg Also visiting on 22/11 was the Aer Turas DC-4 EI-ARS which along with the Argosy was transporting horses to the Newmarket sales.

On 3/12 Cherokee 'SIJ was from and to Teesside and is believed to be a new resident there.

The Dan Air HS 748 'XVG on 11/12 was from and to Newcastle and is presumed to Newcastle based whilst HS 748 'RAY is apparently Leeds based. The Dan Air Nord 262 'YER is up for sale and they are reported to be purchasing three more HS 748's.

The Survey Flights Aztec 'VLP which recently completed a survey mission in Swaziland has now moved on to Ethiopia and is expected back home early in January 1972.

On 8/12 we had a visit from an IroQuois of the United States Army which departed via airways to Liverpool, this was possibly the Burtonwood based 60-3607.

Once again I am indebted to Colin Addison of the L.B.A.S. for the bulk of the movements in this report.
